The mission of C.A.H.P. is to help in the development and support of educational facilities throughout the provinces of Afghanistan that do not have easy access to such facilities. We are also working to establish vocational training programs to assist our students in creating opportunities for self-sustainability.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ June 2005: established our first school for 28 young boys to study math, history, science, Dari, Pashto, and English (writing and reading), and Islamic studies. As of today, enrollment has increased to 46 students with 3 professors on staff. ➤ November 2005: Padkhow-e-shana Orphanage school for boys is officially recognized by Afghan government. ➤ March 2006: Girls Literacy and Vocational Training School opens. An estimated 80 students are currently officially enrolled, although attendance is at about 94 students. 2 well-accredited professors head this school, teaching lessons in Islamic studies, sewing, Dari and Pashto (writing and reading), math, and science. 			
What is your organization planning on doing to help the people in Afghanistan?			
Our organization is planning on continuing to do community based fundraisers to let people know that the problem still exists more than ever before as well as to financially support the schools we have sponsored and future schools we hope to establish. By empowering them with education and knowledge we hope to boost their self-esteem and give them a better chance at developing their futures with more opportunities to jobs. Because the student/teacher ratio is low, the one-on-one lessons they have access to will help boost their confidence and help them learn better. All these things have a positive psychological impact on their future.
